ON FRUITFULNESS...

1) Life begins with Jesus "I am the true vine..."

ON FRUITFULNESS...

- 1) Life begins with Jesus
- 2) Jesus expects us to be fruitful

This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples. (Verse 8)

You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit—fruit that will last. (Verse 16)



QUESTION:

What is the chief end of man?

ANSWER:

Man's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy him forever.

Fruit = Christlikeness

Jesus' nature, attitudes, behaviour, actions

- Empowered prayer life (vs. 7)
- Love (vs. 9)
- Obedience to God (vs. 10)
- Joy (vs. 11)



ON FRUITFULNESS...

- 1) Life begins with Jesus
- 2) Jesus expects us to be fruitful
- 3) God has a stake in our fruitfulness AND
- 4) We have a stake in our fruitfulness

Prune: to trim (a tree, shrub, or bush) by cutting away dead or overgrown branches or stems, especially to increase fruitfulness and growth.

Believing, Doing, Abiding.

Christianity is not simply about believing the right things (though this is important). Nor is it simply a matter of living a Christ-like life (though this is important too). Christian experience must necessarily have a mystical, spiritual, nonquantifiable dimension. To be a disciple means having the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit living in us. It means having a supernatural, interior experience that is completely unlike anything available in the world. It is a way of believing (doctrine) and a way of living (ethics), but these are nurtured by the life-giving connection with Jesus Christ."
