2) Consumerism (Entitlement)





Consumerism is the self-focused drive to get as much as I can with the least amount of effort. It coercively shifts the church away from its true call, from valuing giving to getting. It compels us to protect what we already have and only to give away what has become useless to us. It erodes our sense of duty, honor, loyalty and chivalry to live for the right things and the best things ... Consumerism exists only where it is allowed to exist.
