a: the essential or salient point : CRUX

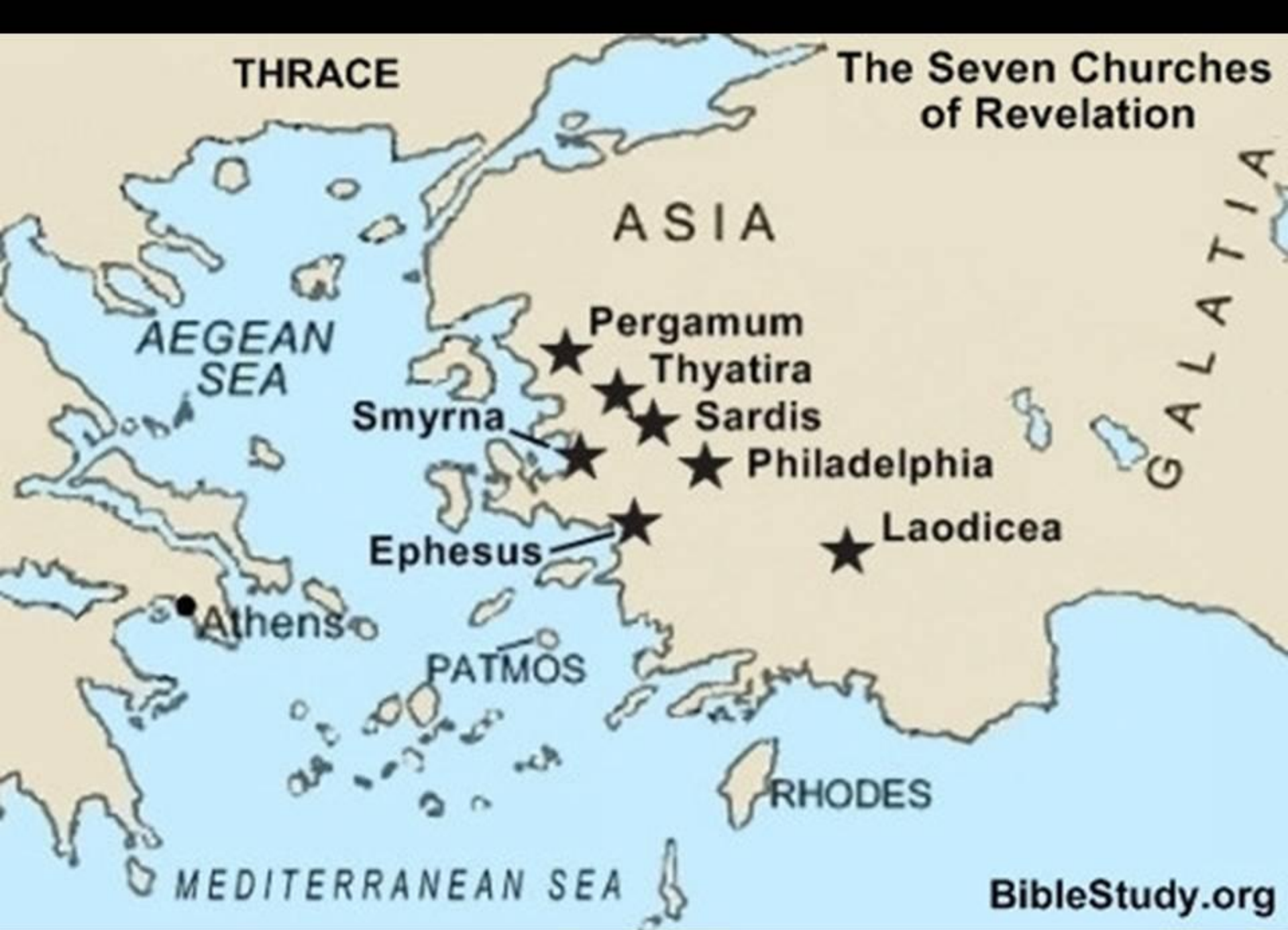
b: the primary or most important consideration. The most important or fundamental aspect of a situation.


