Principle 1: Whoever loves money never has enough. (Eccl. 5:10)

Meaning: The more you have, the more you want.

Principle 2: Whoever loves money is never satisfied with his income. (Eccl. 5:10)

Meaning: The more you have, the less you are satisfied.

Principle 3: As goods increase, so do those who consume them. (Eccl. 5:11)

Meaning: The more you have, the more people (including government!) will come after it.

Principle 4: And what benefit are they to the owner except to feast his eyes on them. (Eccl. 5:11) **Meaning:** The more you have, the more you realize that money does not completely satisfy.

Principle 5: The sleep of a laborer is sweet, whether he eats little or much. The abundance of a rich man permits him no sleep. (Eccl. 5:12)
